Position Summary

The Graduate School of Education at Portland State University (PSU) is seeking a 1.0 FTE 9-month, tenure track faculty appointment, at the Assistant or Associate Professor rank in the Department of Special Education, starting September 16, 2018.

The faculty member will teach courses in special education, pursue external funding, manage existing grant projects, and collaborate in program development and leadership. We are particularly interested in someone with experience in inclusive post-secondary education, transition, and inclusive secondary special education.

The successful candidate will:

- a) co-direct PSU's Career & Community Studies certificate program (<https://www.pdx.edu/career-and-community-studies/>), an inclusive college and employment experience for students with intellectual disabilities
- b) co-direct the Think College Inclusion Oregon (TCIO) Project (<https://thinkcollege.net/>),
- c) teach courses as assigned by the Department Chair;
- d) maintain an active research and publication agenda;
- e) seek external grants funding in personnel preparation and post-secondary education for students with disabilities; and
- f) provide advising, mentorship and support for graduate students.

- Background in the use of technology to support student learning (e.g., Assistive Technology including Augmentative and Alternative Communication).
