The person appointed to this role will also be expected to maintain an active research programme.

Applicants will need to demonstrate the following characteristics:

- Hold a doctoral degree in Education or a related discipline.
- Evidence of an established record of research success including with externally funded research grants, and experience in mentoring others in research.
- A proven record of supervision of Masters and Doctoral students.
- The ability to both develop and lead undergraduate and postgraduate courses in education in their area(s) of expertise and on education-wide issues.
- An understanding of, and the ability to apply, bicultural (and/or cultural) competence in an Aotearoa New Zealand context.
- A demonstrated commitment to culturally responsive and collaborative research and teaching.
