The School of Teacher Education and Leadership at Utah State University is seeking a Professional Practice Assistant Professor with a primary emphasis on school leadership and a secondary focus on foundations of education. Located on the main campus in Logan, Utah, this is a term appointment, academic year, nine-month position with the opportunity for summer employment, dependent on the availability of funds. The position is not remote-eligible and contingent on a successful background check.
